ACRYLIC PAINT is available in tubes, jars and bottles.

PROFESSIONAL paint is more highly pigmented than STUDENT quality, which uses less expensive pigments and extenders to make it fit the student budget.



QUALITIES

- Water soluble, but waterproof when dry
- Quick drying
- Easy cleanup ... just soap and water
- Adheres well to most surfaces

Good for Brush and Knife Painting, Collage, Air Brush, Mural Painting and Decorative Painting

BRUSHES

ROUND →

for thin to thick strokes and detail



FLAT →

for Broad Strokes



BRIGHT →

for broad strokes with thicker paint



FAN

for blending and softening edges

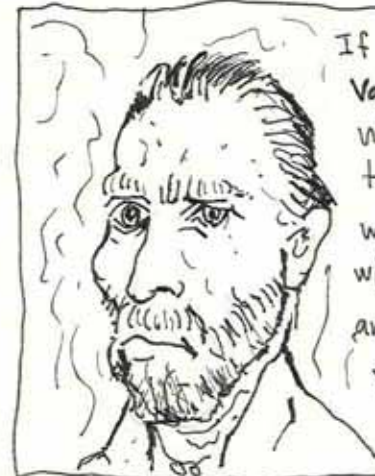
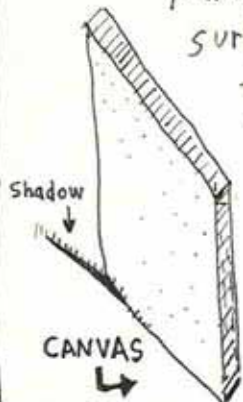


BRUSHES come in many shapes and sizes. The

technique and scale of the painting will determine which works best. Synthetic brushes are superior for acrylic and should be cleaned thoroughly with soap and water when finished.

You can paint on virtually any absorbent surface.. canvas, paper, cardboard..

The advantage of acrylic is its incredible adhesive qualities, flexibility, and durability. It does not yellow with time nor will it deteriorate its support as oil paint does.
